COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND SUPPORT: Our program has been going strong all summer. Throughout August, with the help of our many community partners including St. Mark's, Brooklin United Church and Whitby Free Methodist Church, plus our many energetic volunteers from St. Andrew's, we have been able to provide 39 families with back to school supplies for over 79 children. That means that 15 junior and senior kindergarten children, 22 grade 1-3 kids, 14 grade 4-6 kids, 13 grade 7-8 children and 15 high school students had new backpacks, school supplies and lunch bags. It was wonderful to see the joy that this part of our ministry was able to give the children and families at the start of the new school year! Thanks be to God!
