

This week's worship minute...

Numbers 11:1-35

John 1:1-18

Darkness is nothing in and of itself; it is simply the absence of light.

John's Gospel reminds us that the light of Christ shines in the darkness and that the darkness cannot overcome it.

Sometimes it can be difficult to see the light, but it is always there even if in the far off distance.

In the book of Numbers we see that the people of God are very short sighted.

It seems they fail to see the light of God in their midst.

We soon see that God is angered by this (see verses 1, 10, and 33).

It can be troubling to see God so angry, and yet that is precisely what we see in Numbers 11.

God never abandons us. His light never ceases to shine. Even if it is sometimes a fire of anger.

How does it make you feel to see God angry?

What can we learn about God when we see Him angry because of our short sightedness and impatience?
